From the Heights

Pastor's Message

Dear Church Family,

As many of you know, for the last few weeks Mike has been participating in an intensive outpatient aphasia therapy program at the same facility where he did his specialized rehab back in 2022. He will continue this therapy through the next month or so.

As Mike began his therapy, I have had several people ask me what Aphasia is, what it means, and what it looks like for him and for us as a family. If you have felt like asking me, or been curious about, those questions, you are not alone.

According to the National Aphasia Association, around 2 million Americans live with some form of aphasia, but 84.5% of Americans have never even *heard* the term. Which means that, as some have put it, it may just be the most common brain disorder that you've never heard of.

Simply put, aphasia is a result of damage to the communication center of the brain, most commonly by stroke but can also be caused by traumatic brain injury, tumors, and other neurological causes and deteriorations. There are several different ways that aphasia presents, but generally the condition is an acquired communication disorder that impairs a person's ability to process language, but does not affect intelligence. Aphasia impairs the ability to speak and understand others, and most people with aphasia experience difficulty reading and writing.

For Mike, what this means is that he takes longer to process incoming communications, and sometimes needs things repeated, phrased differently in order for him to process what is being said to him. He also has difficulty finding the right words to express himself, often mixing up words, like the words he's looking for are mixed in a big bowl with other similar or related words, and he grabs the wrong one. Interestingly, his ability to read and write has not been impacted, so when his aphasia is really strong, we resort to writing things down (or typing them out on our phones) for full understanding. For Mike, too, the impact of his aphasia means that he can have difficulty processing all sorts of incoming information, so sequencing and planning of activities is difficult and acting out the steps he may have in his head can be difficult or come out confused (think: throwing away the plate, and putting the napkin in the sink).

At the end of the day, a little bit of patience and a whole lot of grace goes a very long way in helping and understanding him.

While there is no cure for aphasia, this program that he's doing should help him find and develop adaptations and ways to live with his aphasia. We are thankful for this program at this stage of his continued stroke recovery, and we are thankful for all the love and support you all continue to show us along the way.

In addition to helping explain what's going on with Mike and, as an extension, our family, I'm also sharing this all with you because, as I said above, there are around 2 million Americans living with aphasia in America today. That's about .6% of the population, not a large percentage, but not insignificant, either. In terms of Lincoln, it would mean that there would statistically be around 1700 people, mostly older adults, living with some form of aphasia in our community. And when you think about it in those terms: chances are, you run into someone with aphasia more often than you think. As with so many things in our world today, we simply don't know what the people around us are dealing with or experiencing in their lives, and, as with Mike, a little bit of patience and a whole lot of grace goes a long way.

May we always approach others with all the love and the grace that God has given us. Grace and Peace,






